Dates: July 30 – August 3, 2025

Location: Presque Isle, Maine

General Exhibition Hall Rules

- Items shown in previous years at the Northern Maine Agricultural Fair cannot be re-entered.
- Only items made by the exhibitor may be entered. Items must be new, clean, and finished within the last year.
- Judges may withhold prizes for items deemed unworthy, even if there is no competition.
- "Best of Show" is selected by judges and cannot be entered directly.
- Judges' and Superintendents' decisions are final.
- Enter the Exhibition Hall through the Judd Street Gate for drop-off and the State Street Gate for pick-up.
- For prizes totaling \$600 or more, you must provide your Social Security or Federal ID number for IRS reporting.
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Drop-off and Pick-up Instructions

Drop-off:

- Use Judd Street Gate for easy access.

Pick-up:

- Use Judd Street Gate
- Park on Judd Street side of building
- Pick up entries and premiums: Sunday, August 3rd, 3:30-4:30pm and Monday, August 4th, 5pm-6pm.
- No entry passes for pick-up on Sunday.

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Entry Requirements

- Each department requires its own entry form.
- All items must be original, made by the exhibitor, and not previously awarded first place at this fair.
- Violation of rules results in forfeiture of prizes and ribbons.

Exhibition Hall Contest Rules

1. No Repeat Entries

Articles previously displayed at the Northern Maine Agricultural Fair may not be exhibited again.

2. Judging Standards

Articles deemed unworthy in a class without competition will not receive a premium.

3. Exhibitor Requirements

All items must be made by the exhibitor listed. Items must be:

- Newly made
- Well laundered
- Completed within the current year

4. Best of Show

This award is determined solely by the judge and cannot be entered for consideration.

5. Disputes and Decisions

In the event of a dispute in any Needlework class, the decision of the Judges and/or Superintendent is final. All entries are accepted under these terms.

6. Entry Location

Enter through the Judd Street Gate for convenient access to the Agriculture Exhibition Building.

7. IRS Reporting Requirements

- Prizes, awards, or premiums totaling \$600.00 or more must be reported to the IRS.
- You must provide your Federal ID (E.I.) number or Social Security number.
- Failure to provide this may result in a 20% withholding of the prize amount.
- All participants eligible for prizes must submit this information.

Exhibition Hall Pick-Up Instructions

- **Gate: Use the State Street Gate**

How to Fill Out the Premium Entry Form

Step 1: Read the Premium Book

Look through the Premium Book to decide what items you want to enter. Each department has specific rules, entry dates, and times. Make note of:

- The Department # (e.g., Baked Goods, Crafts, etc.)
 - The Division # (subcategories within the department)
 - The Article # (specific item you're entering)
 - The Name of the Article (e.g., Apple Pie, Wooden Birdhouse)

Step 2: Complete the Entry Form

Fill in all parts of the form clearly:

- Your name, phone number, and mailing address
- Use a separate form for each department you enter
- List all your entries in the table provided

Be sure to sign the bottom of the form—this confirms that your work is original, created by you, and hasn't won first place at this fair in past years.

Step 3: Plan Your Drop-Off

Check the Premium Book for the entry drop-off date and time for each department you're entering. Your items must be dropped off during those designated times.

Step 4: Choose Your Tag Option

You have two options for getting your entry tags:

Option A: Get tags in advance (to avoid lines)

- Bring your items on the scheduled drop-off day—your tags will be ready for you!
